



SAAM FOUNDATION VIMY MEMORIAL BRICK WALL



Vickers Vimy G-EAOU, winner of the 1919 UK-Australia air race and the first aircraft to be flown from UK to Australia, was displayed from 1958 through 2022 in a purpose-built pavilion at Adelaide Airport. The pavilion was floored with bricks. When the Vimy was moved to its current display in the passenger terminal, Adelaide Airport donated these historic bricks to the Museum.
